



Control Commission Judge

Equipment and procedure – generic

1. Preparation

1.1.	Confirm with Western Cape Rowing/Regatta Organiser that Laptop, Printer, sufficient paper for printing and plastic bags will be at Regatta for the issuing of Temporary ID cards.	
1.2.	Confirm with the Regatta organiser that electricity, a table and a minimum of 3 chairs will be available at the Control Commission tent/gazebo.	
1.3.	Western Cape Rowing is responsible for the issuing of Temporary ID cards under the supervision of the Judge at Control Commission.	
1.4.	Obtain Regatta Programme with all crew members listed for distribution to Officials at Control Commission. Western Cape Rowing is responsible to print the Programme which lists all crew members.	
1.5.	Confirm wrist bands are available for Coxswains and light weight rowers.	
1.6.	Collect Radio.	
1.7.	Set up scale for weighing of Coxswains and lightweight crews.	

2. Weighing

2.1.	<u>Weighing of Coxswains</u> (Between 1-2 hours before race time of first event) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> At C Class Regattas: Upon request from Control Commission officials at In-coming or Out-going jetties. <input type="checkbox"/> At B Class Regattas: All coxswains for JM/W19, U23, Senior and Master Crews – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Minimum weight for female crews – 50kg. o Minimum weight for male crews – 55kg. <input type="checkbox"/> No coxswain for a female crew may weigh less than 40kg for U23/Senior and Masters and not less than 35kg for JW19 crew. <input type="checkbox"/> No coxswain for a male crew may weigh less than 45kg for U23/Senior and Masters and not less than 40kg for JM19 crew. 	
2.2.	<u>Weighing of lightweight Crews</u> (Between 1-2 hours before race time of first event for the day) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Female: Average weight of 57kg for crew no single rower >59kg. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Single Sculler: 59kg <input type="checkbox"/> Male: Average weight of 70kg for crew no single rower >72kg. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Single Sculler: 72kg 	

3. Crew Changes

3.1.	Crew changes can only be made by the Club Representative.	
3.2.	Crew changes can only be approved on presentation of a RowSA Registration Card (exception JM/W14 until January).	
3.3.	Crew changes must be recorded by the Judge at Control Commission on the Master Sheet and note to the effect given to representative of club that the crew change has been recorded and the crew must present this note to the Officials at Control Commission.	
3.4.	Refer to Regatta Rules for crew changes after heats.	
3.5.	Regatta Control should be notified only if the stroke name of a crew has been changed.	

4. End of day procedure

4.1.	Master Sheet with crew changes to be handed to Regatta Control to be captured on Regatta System.	
4.2.	Return Radio.
